

Museum Rules for School Children

We welcome school children, while for security reasons, the following rules are advised to be followed:

- 1) The touching of exhibits is prohibited, such as earthen walls, cooking hearths and other folk items.
- 2) Do not step on the door-sills when you enter the house.
- 3) The shoes have to be taken off before entering rooms.
- 4) Do not run or behave unreasonably within the museum.
- 5) Stay away from dangerous areas such as steep slopes and cliffs.
- 6) The consuming of food and drinks is allowed only in designated places, such as the rest areas.
- 7) Please refrain from collecting the museum stamps in the stamp boxes.

As for advance request, we wonder if you could inform your children three minimum rules in the museum, by copying and handing out the simple notice sheet for kids, titled “Things to Care About in the Museum”.

If you have extra chance to talk something about the Japanese culture during your class, we will be pleased if you could navigate your children to think the reason why they should follow the museum rules. For example, Japanese people are usually taking off their shoes before getting into the rooms in order to keep the floors clean, as they sometimes spread cushions or mattress directly on the floor to sit and sleep, not using chairs and beds.
